June 8 to 12, 2020**

Welcome to the very first digital laboratory on public space organized by TRYSPACES. The laboratory contains a series of online activities to initiate discussions, meet and exchange virtually between TRYSPACES members on more than ever topical issues concerning public space. This preliminary program is an overview of the activities planned throughout the week.

At the beginning of each day of the laboratory, the Central coordination team will send you a detailed email of the day's activities as well as links to access the various contents. Activities will also be shared on the private Facebook group created for the Lab, which will be the central platform for sharing and interacting throughout the week. You will therefore be guided through the day's "menu". A continuous interaction space will also be created on the WhatsApp platform to exchange between laboratory participants throughout the week. Most of the contents have no fixed schedule and are of the "take away" type, with the exception of a live launch activity on June 8 and comparative workshops on June 10 and 11, 2020 scheduled at a specific time so that everyone can participate and exchange. All live activities with a specific schedule are marked **in red** in this program.

As the lab progresses, we ask you to indicate on the Facebook group that you have completed an activity by applying the "Like" mark to the publication. We also strongly encourage you to write your comments under publications to share your thoughts and exchange with your peers on specific contents. At the end of the laboratory, you will be asked to complete an individual summary document. Upon receipt of this document, we will give you a certificate of participation in the laboratory on public space by TRYSPACES.

We look forward to reflecting together on the current situation due to COVID-19 and anticipating the next impacts on participatory research and on the way young people experience public space!
